Trilobite Fossil Rocks

Trilobites are a variety of arthropod that inhabited every niche in the Cambrian and Permian seas. These animals had three major lobes: the cephalon (head), a segmented thorax and a pygidium (tail piece). Since trilobite fossils are a rare find, make your own trilobite fossil using a rock!

Know before you begin

- This activity can be done inside or outside
- All supplies are easy to find, substitute or modify
- Adult supervision is recommended
- Please choose a safe space to play

Materials

- Rocks
- Paint or Permanent Markers
- Paintbrush

Instructions

Paint rock to look like trilobite.

- Paint lines to show the different lobes: cephalon (head), a segmented thorax and a pygidium (tail piece).
- Paint compound eyes.
- Paint three sections left to right on the Trilobite's body.
- Optional: Add adaptations like head spikes, thorax spikes or pygidium spikes.

What other adaptations did trilobites have?

• **Optional**: Add jointed legs to bottom of trilobite because, as an arthropod, your trilobite would have jointed legs.
