## NORTH PHILLY SCIENCE SCHOOL STUDENTS PARTICIPATE IN PRESS PREVIEW OF GEORGE WASHINGTON CARVER EXHIBIT *Friday, November 13, 10 a.m.*

WHAT: Students from George Washington Carver School for Engineering and Science, a North Philadelphia public magnet high school, are the first to tour the Academy of Natural Sciences' fall exhibit George Washington Carver. - **BACKGROUND:** George Washington Carver, a groundbreaking scientist, educator and humanitarian who laid the groundwork for organic farming and today's research on plant-based fuels, is the subject of a new exhibit at the Academy of Natural Sciences beginning Saturday, Nov. 14. *George Washington Carver* makes its East Coast debut with more than 150 historical artifacts, videos, interactive displays and re-created scenes that trace Carver's modest beginning as a child of a slave in the Deep South to a world-renowned scientist with a postage stamp, submarine and national monument in his honor.
