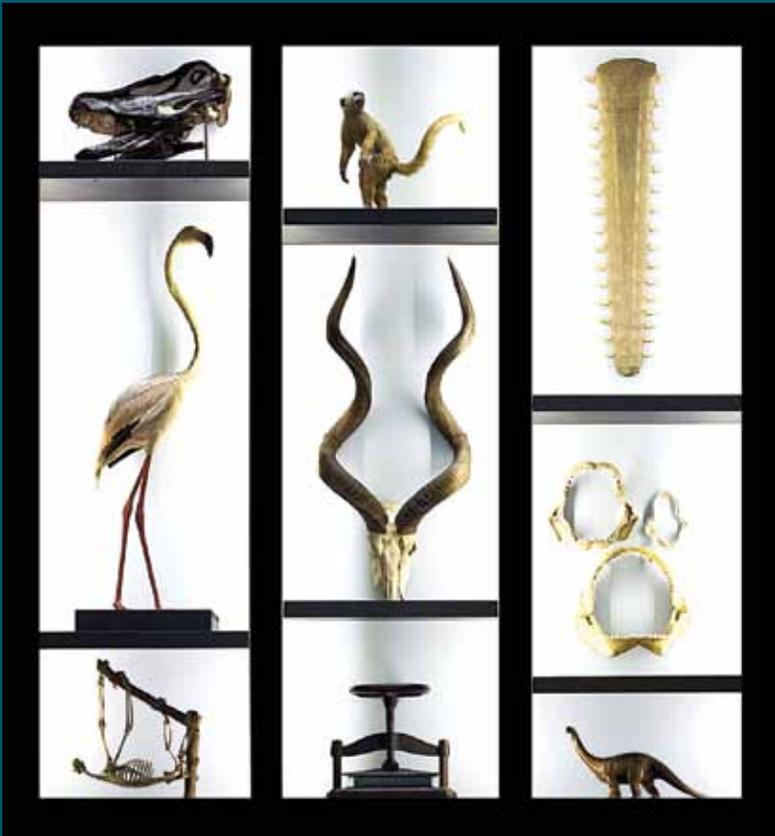

RESEARCH

The Academy of Natural Sciences is an active research institution, and our corporate partners help to fund the vital scientific work that takes place here each day. Our scientists focus on critical issues in biodiversity, evolution, and environmental science, from discovering new species of catfish in the Amazon to studying the effects of natural gas drilling in the Marcellus Shale. Academy research helps us to better understand how various parts of our world interact, and our corporate supporters are important partners in this endeavor.



COLLECTIONS

The Academy's collections total more than 17 million specimens, and rate among the world's most significant in terms of geographic, biological, and historical depth and breadth. From Thomas Jefferson's fossil collection and John James Audubon's birds to specimens from our most recent expeditions, these collections help us understand how our world changes over time.

EXHIBITIONS

While the Academy is best known for its iconic dinosaurs, we also offer a wealth of additional exhibit experiences, from our tropical butterfly garden to our many dioramas. We host nature-inspired artwork in our Art of Science Gallery, as well as three traveling exhibits each year. For details, see the enclosed exhibit preview.

SENSES

Supporting and Enriching Natural Science
Education in Schools



Founded in 2004 and expanded in 2008, SENSES is an innovative education program that reaches underserved students in the Philadelphia and Camden school districts. SENSES provides free or reduced-cost museum visits and lessons, or “Academy on the Go” outreach programs for Title I schools, and is EITC eligible. These high-quality science experiences incorporate science across the curriculum and help students develop 21st-century science skills to face real-world challenges.

EDUCATION

The Academy reaches more than 50,000 schoolchildren each year through museum visits, lessons, and “Academy on the Go” outreach programs in local schools. Our Women in Natural Sciences (WINS) and SENSES programs provide specialized attention for underserved populations.

Please inquire about donating through the EITC program of Pennsylvania, wherein corporations may receive tax credits of 75-90% of their contribution by supporting the Academy’s innovative educational programs.

PROGRAMS

The Academy offers events for learners of all ages through a variety of programs, including lectures, author talks, environmental forums, films, and more. From public forums on sustainability topics to scientist-guided field trips, we engage thousands of Philadelphia residents in Academy programming each year.

EXHIBIT AND EVENT SPONSORSHIP

We reach over 50,000 schoolchildren each year through museum visits and outreach programs. 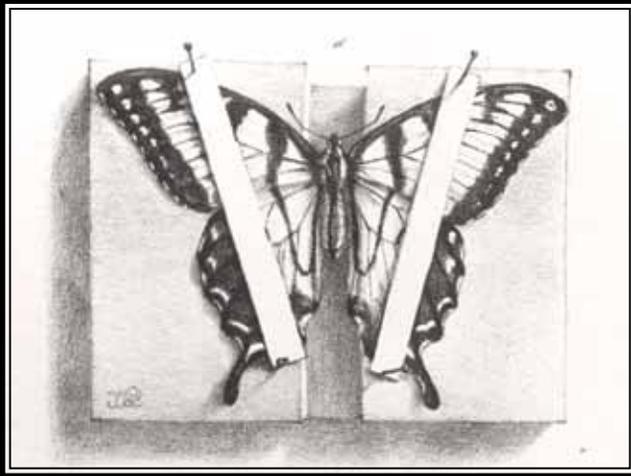
