I cannot touch the dinosaur skeletons that are behind the railings.




quiet space

movie

skeletons

There are two dinosaur skeletons that I can touch on the 2nd floor of Dinosaur Hall. The dinosaur skeletons are not alive.

The skeleton is hard and bumpy in places. I can also touch the teeth of the dinosaur skeleton.



goggles
